SUMMER IN BADEN-BADEN

Leonid Tsygkin, introduction by Susan Sontag Smuggled out of the Soviet Union in 1982, this novel first appeared in English in 1987 and soon disappeared, to be resurrected thanks to Susan Sontag's enthusiasm for a 'scruffy-looking' copy she turned up on Charing Cross Road. It's an exuberant ode to Russian literature, especially Dostoevsky, whom Tsygkin imagines on his tempestuous honeymoon; and also a tale of perhaps two unrequited loves. £9.99

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Asako Yuzuki, translated by Polly Barton An exuberant romp of a thriller: career-driven journalist Rika finds that the best way to secure an interview with a maybe-serial-killer is through her stomach, trying out the rich recipes that may or may not have caused the deaths of her elderly victims. As Rika is beguiled by her subject's lifestyle of sensuality and excess, she begins to chafe against Japan's rigid social expectations for women. pbk £14.99

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
